#### HAND OF THE MONTH PAUL AND THE RED KINGS

Have you ever played with a partner who trumped your ace? How about one who discards good tricks? ... Maddening isn't it ... well sometimes. The following hand was played by Paul Hagen in a recent tournament, so read on and decide if you would have been upset when he discarded a good trick. We arrived at 3 N.T. with the opponents silent.

S Q 10 x x H A K 8 7 D x x C x x x

S x x x H Q 10 9 x D Q x x x C A Q S A J 9 x H x x x D 10 x x C 10 x x

SKXX HJ DAKJX CKJ987

Opening lead - low heart.

Paul ducked the heart to his Jack, led the club Jack and took the unfortunate diamond switch with his Jack. (are Jacks wild?). He then misquessed the clubs by leading the King. West now led a high heart. Paul won with the Ace, knocked out the club ten and took the diamond return, by east, in his hand. He then cashed his two remaining clubs coming down to this end position.

Paul now led the diamond King, discarding the heart King!! A spade to the King now endplayed east in spades for the ninth trick. Note that discarding a spade on the diamond King is fatal as east can duck the spade King or take the spade Queen and return the Jack.
